Forges buying pig iron are not listed by forge name, but "Coventryville, "Valley Forge" but under the proprietor's and as purchasers of forge needs. Naturally, MOST some forges enter the <u>Journal</u> as buyers of 500 pound forge hammers, anvils and fire-box castings.

NO Berks county forges were purchasers in 1784-85 except Geo Ege's Charming
Forge and then only for a single pig purchase of 25 tons. This suggests that John P
Patton's Berkshire Furnace in Ege's neighborhood right then was out of blast; that
Hopewell's pig price was lower is hardly possible.

Thomas Pott's forge is most likely nearby Coventryville Forge, Pott's property intil about 1800 when May bought that forge. Deweese purchases are NOT for Valley Forge, but for the Birdsboro Forges which he is operating 1782-85. He bought pig, forge hammers and firebox castings. But his "shot and shell" purchase is an illustration of "swords being beat into plowshares", into wagon tire and horseshoe bar iron. Passmore, forge owner on the Brandwhine in Chester County is far of interest for the same reason. He hammered three GREAT GUNS into bar iron. His purchase also the sole Record proof at Hopewell that Mark Bird did cast cannon here. Joseph Potts of Glasgow Forge of 1772, then one-third owned by Bird, is NOT in this Journal, but Jesse Potts bought two forge hammers.

These pig buyers should be checked in the U.S. Census of 1990, to definitely terms locate their forges. All had to be nearby so that pig could be wagoned to them.

(The same check applies to the working forge at Bdsbo and in Union Twp.)
