MASTER COLLIER THOMAS SIMS (p/130, 143)

As the other Master Colliers Sims bought the wood cut from Mark Bird's land(no indication whene whatsoever) and paid for hauling every stick into the hearth for coaling. From 1652 cords, Sims and his helpers produced 19 wagon loads of coal, about 2.38 cords for a load of 24 baskets. (p 9) Since colliers had to work Sindays once a hearth was fired, this production was about 3.65 olads daily for 197 days. He also paid helpers Shuberd and Rice a Shilling a load for drawing 139 loads each of this coal. Whether these men worked singly or as partners is unknown; they did coal for other Master Colliers.

SIMS, Master Collier No hint of family whatso ever; 322 pounds of flour and 14 of cornneal, less tha than a pound-loaf a day, might have been condumed by a single man./His meat pu purchases, 2452 pork of which 193 was probably one WHOLE butchered pig and his mackeral purchases suggest salting of pork and mackeral. He bought 55 mackeral, several times in by the dozen.. Ha then averaged a mackeral a week. Heat, adding \mathbb{Z}_2^1 of bacon and $197\frac{1}{2}$ of beaf, averaged almost a pound daily. He had a horse shod once. Used tobacco heavier than most workers. scattered bought five qts of whiskey and two of rum(18 pence), not sufficiently that he can't be threed a"drunk". He had no docking fines as Witherington. Drew CASH twenty-three timestotaling 114.4.5, abt \$303.24, twice amo ats EXCEEDING his final"Debt" to Mark Bird. 19.1.8, abt \$51.88. probably Purchased no cloth, so his three Pound tailoring bill with McCormick/came fromxexexx cloth purchases from John G_ay and George Douglass. His/skilled charcoalmaking is reflected by the purchase of seven pairs of shoes Sole "extravagance" might have been the purchase of 3/4 pound of and the return candle tallow > Purchase of a Hopewell cast skillet and potalso reflects on his occupation.

However, of his coaling regund only six months, his use of meat and flow doubled: two pounds loans and nearly 2 pounds of ment daily.
